Community Centre Renovation Plan

We are delighted to inform you work has started on the community centre. The main improvements that we hope to complete include:

- Renovate, insulate and improve the heating in the meeting room and kitchen area
- Upgrade the shower facilities and changing rooms
- Paint the entire building

- Install a new toilet which can be accessed from the outside (without the need to unlock the entire building)
- Repair the main hall roof and floor
- Upgrade sewerage system to be compliant with current environmental standards

KILCORNAN NATIONAL SCHOOL "FUNDING APPROVED FOR EXPANSION". Our National School have been granted funding for additional accommodation to include a mainstream classroom including en-suite toilets and 2 SEN rooms.

TRAFFIC CALMING BETWEEN
CURRAGHCHASE AND
DROMLOHAN/COWPARK CROSSES
The Community Council are continuing to
work with our local and national politicians
to put in place the Traffic Route Lighting,
and enhanced traffic calming measures,
including a reduced speed limit of 50kph
(30mph) between the two N69 road
junctions in Kilcornan.
It is understood the Design Stage for the

It is understood the Design Stage for the Road Project has been completed, with amendments, that include footpaths and cycle, lanes east and west of the National School, now approved/agreed by Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII). The process/project now proceeds to the Part 8 Planning stage with the approval of the TII awaited. Deputy Neville has put down a **Dail Parliamentary Question for Minister** Shane Ross, requesting a time frame based on the Minister's previous commitment for the project to be completed in 2018. Any updates, as they arise, will be posted on the Community Facebook Page, and also included in our next newletter.

LIMERICK CITY & COUNTY COUNCIL'S PROPOSED SPEED LIMITS REVIEW 2018 ON THE N69 AT KILCORNAN
The Kilcornan Community Council have made a submission to the Limerick City & County Council's in respect of the above mentioned Speed Limit Review. It is proposed that the existing 60kph speed limit be reduced from it's current location on the N69 (east of the Pallaskenry junction) to the Curraghchase Cross.
The Community Council in it's submission have requested the following:-

- 1. The existing 60kph speed limit be extended eastwards to include the Crokerspark/ Blossomhill/Derreen road junctions.
- 2. The 50kph Speed Limit between the Curraghchase and Dromlohan/Cowpark Crosses be included in the Review.
- 3. The current 60kph speed limit between the Dromlohan/Cowpark and Killen/Cowpark junctions be retained, acting as a traffic calming measure for the "lead-in" to the 50kph speed zone.

Copies of the Speed Limit Submission have been circulated to all our Area Councillors, and West Limerick TD's, requesting their support.

KILCORNAN TIDY TOWNS

We've had a very busy year and have participated in many projects to improve the environment in Kilcornan. As well as the TLC4 cleanup on Good Friday for which there was a great response with cleaning going on all week, collecting 50 bags of rubbish and 25 bags of recyclables, there has been ongoing litter picking with residents taking responsibility for their own roads. Dumping has also been reported to the Council. During the year we participated in the BirdWatch Garden Bird Survey and the Greenhomes Survey. Bee Patches have been appearing on roadsides, in gardens, in the Community pitch as well as in Curraghchase and the Caravan Park as patches of long grass are left to grow, as shelter and nesting, and Wildflowers allowed to flourish as food for bees and other pollinators. Official Tidy Towns signs as well as colourful posters, designed by the children in Kilcornan National School, have been erected to explain the Bee Patches. The tubs and newly painted repurposed wheelbarrows add a touch of colour to the whole area. Our aim, next year, is to persuade people of the importance and beauty of Wildflowers and wild patches with the hope that we cut back on the amount of spray that we are all inclined to use to control Nature on or near our properties. Many thanks to all who supported us in our activities in 2018. Adjudication takes place any time in June or July so keep an eye on the litter and remove any that you see, Finally congratulations to Kilcornan National School on achieving their 8th Green Flag - a wonderful achievement.
